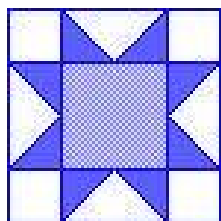

BLOCK OF THE MONTH

If you did not receive your BOM packet at the June meeting, Margaret and Debbie will have them available at the September meeting. If you would like to obtain a packet before the September meeting contact either of the committee ladies and they will see you get a packet. Blocks will be uploaded to our website for your convenience as well.

You must pick a pattern from one of the 15 given out by the committee to make each month but you must use the correct fabric theme listed below for that month. You may add other fabrics to your block and each block is 12" finished. You may make the same pattern every month or pick a different pattern every month or alternate but it must be from the 15. The fat quarter exchange will coincide with the BOM themes; this should help all of us to use the correct fabrics. (w/w means white on white ow/ow means off white on off white)

September - Thirties repro and w/w

October- Predominately Black Print or black tone-on-tone and w/w

November- Thimbleberries and ow/ow

December - Holiday Floral and ow/ow

January - Novelties and w/w

February- Batik and ow/ow

March - Civil War and ow/ow

April- Polka Dot and w/w

May - Floral and w/w

June- Pastels and w/w
