Here is the project, don't forget to sign up with Sharon Rehrig or Sharon Kubich for the Christmas in April workshop. Sharon Rehrig has chosen the project. It is a beautiful table topper. The date is Friday, April 18<sup>th</sup> from 6:00 to 9:30 PM. The cost is \$15.00 per person. Patterns are \$8.50 and available in advance so you can cut your pieces ahead of time. There are only three fabrics involved: focus fabric, coordinating fabric and background. Kits will be available for \$25 for the top and binding. You should be able to complete the project that night but if you don't, you will have plenty of time between April and Santa's arrival to complete it. Sharon Kubich will be baking Christmas cookies to get you in the mood to work on a Christmas project in April.
