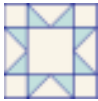

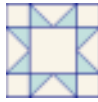

Beginning balance June 8, 2009 - \$6,733.38

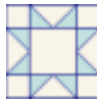
Ending balance October 12, 2009 - \$8,069.95

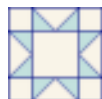

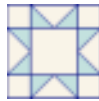

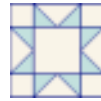
MADE IN NEW YORK

MADE IN NEW YORK: City Quilting will be an exhibition that celebrates the best in New York metropolitan area quilting with 63 quilts on display for 7 weeks, and we thought members of Evening Star Quilt Guild would like to know about it.

Manhattan's quilt shop, [The City Quilter](#), has organized the exhibit, running from September 22, 2009 through November 14, 2009 at the [Williams Club](#), located at 24 East 39th Street. The 63 quilts will cover most of the public spaces on the first two floors of the Club as well as the basement gallery area. Viewing hours are from 8 am to 8 pm, 7 days per week. Some of the quilts are in meeting rooms, and may not be accessible at all times. People can call the Club in advance (212-697-5300).

For submission, a quilt must have been made while the quilter was living or working in the New York metro area. The quilts were juried, selected from 203 that were submitted. The chosen quilts reflect a wide range of quilting styles, from traditional designs to the contemporary.

As part of the show, there is a special exhibition of ten [Dear Jane](#) quilts. This special focus commemorates the 10 years of Dear Jane classes at The City Quilter, and the community that has consequently developed.

Painted Faces for Beginners Workshop

I will provide the face and almost all of the supplies, you provide the spirit of adventure. Once you've tried it, you will want to go paint your own family faces.



Supplies

Kit Fee- \$26.00USD (includes almost everything you will need - fabric, brushes, paint, and paint supplies)

Sharp pencil

Masking Tape - can be shared

Iron and ironing surface (can be shared)

OPTIONAL - Desk light or Ott light with extension cord, cash or checkbook if you would like to purchase additional items, like paints, to take home
