Did a little Brown Floral art quilt to use as a sample for a demo at our quilt show last year. She was demonstrating how to finish with uneven curved edges. The techniques used were fussy-cut batiks, fused raw-edge machine appliqué, trapunto, and machine quilting. She entered it in the NJ State Fair on a whim, mostly because she had no other art quilts finished. Imagine her surprise when she won First Place in the class Art Quilt-Professional and a pink ribbon for a special award given to the top art quilt.

Leanna also entered Cherrywood Fabrics first challenge she was to make a 20" square quilt using their pack of Wicked Green & Black fabrics inspired

by the book & show Wicked. After they saw all the quilts together, they decided to publish a book. Leanna's witch is pictured in the book.

This year she entered again, same requirements but inspired by the movie The Lion King. There were 304 entries with the winning 120 going on tour to AQS Shows in 2016 – 2017. Leanna was one of the 120 that will be on display at Houston in a couple of weeks. The nearest AQS shows to us are Lancaster in March and Syracuse next summer.
