

Some of us prefer to believe in the "quilting makes the quilt" idea where the white background is ideal to showcase the gorgeous quilting!

The workshop on Wednesday was well received. Hopefully some of the attendees will present their projects during Show and Tell and share their experience with Gyleen's techniques.

Pet Beds and Supplies

Dixie Sutton will present her charity project at the December meeting. We will be making pet beds, primarily for cats at our January Stitching in Hope session.


Fabric has already been donated for the beds, but if you have one yard pieces of fleece for blankets, please consider donating it to our cause. The feline mats are similar to placemats in size and thickness, so small cuts of batting will be appreciated as well.

We will not use leftover fabric scraps to stuff the beds, as the dogs and cats tend to tear that style which creates a



mess for the volunteers and hazards for the animals.

Dixie will provide a list of food, litter, and other items needed by the shelter if you do not wish to make pet beds,
