Joyce Hughes Presented Dimensional Thread Painting



Calling You on the Carpet

In case some of you are not aware of this idiom, it basically means that we need to clear up a few things.

Our website (esqg.com) is available to ALL of our members and portions of it are also visible to the outside world. Items such as our minutes, the treasurer's reports, and our membership list are protected and available only to members. These items require a login and password which is given to each of you when you join the guild. The blank stares at each meeting indicate that many of you do not read the minutes online, nor do you look over the treasurer's report. A lot of work goes into both of those reports, and I (as president, former Treasurer, former VP, and stand-in Secretary on several occasions) feel it's a common courtesy to at least take a few minutes to review them prior to the general meeting. Whispers at the meetings of people needing to see a physical copy of the treasurer's report or the minutes at our meetings not only wastes paper, but seems redundant when the report is already online, usually at least a week ahead of time and available to all members. Also, when there are questions or "demands" regarding the financials, our treasurer does not have the information available at the time to be able to properly respond to last minute queries. Read the financials before you arrive and email the treasurer before the meeting with your questions or requests so she has time to prepare. As a former guild Treasurer myself for 13 years, I am well aware of the frustrations of last minute questions and demands.

Use the website! There is a wealth of information on the website. All members are listed and you can find their addresses and phone numbers in the protected membership list (you can even print out a hard copy if you so desire!). Pictures of prior events are there. Historical newsletters, minutes, and financials are there. Our meeting schedule and times are posted. The by-laws are accessible. The raffle quilt photo and current event information is available. Again, people put a lot of work into maintaining our website and you should all be using it. The information is there folks. Please use it!
