A Note From the ESQG President

The human spirit is an amazing thing! In light of the aftermath of Hurricane Helene, which absolutely destroyed parts of Florida, Georgia, the Carolinas and Tennessee, stories of unique heroism and community are beginning to emerge from the mountainous areas ravaged by the storm.

As some of you know, I have family in the Asheville area and I am aware that other members of our guild do also. I am happy to report that my brother and his family are fine and must have had a guardian angel watching over them, perhaps it was our mother (who, by the way, was also named Helen). Beginning Friday afternoon, my brother was out helping neighbors cut up felled trees, emptying out his freezer, preparing and delivering meals for people without power, and checking on his neighbors to be sure everyone was okay. On Saturday, he and his wife went to the schools where they taught and emptied the refrigerators and freezers, then cooked and delivered the food to local families devastated by the storm. He traveled to Raleigh and Charlotte to load up on gas and water to bring back to the people of Asheville who now had nothing and no way out if they did not already have a full tank of gas. He is still running today, a week later, attempting to get groceries, water, gas, and supplies to the people in his community and surrounding areas. He is our "feet on the ground" down there and others like him are doing the same.

Oddly enough, there's also a little quilt shop in Weaverville, NC called "The Five Little Monkeys Quilt Shop," whose owner had similar luck as my brother. Her house was the only one in her neighborhood unharmed. Her shop had very little damage other than loss of power and water. She is using her company van to run supplies into Asheville on a daily basis from her escape haven in Jonesboro. She describes the horrors of the storm, how it turned trees into toothpicks, and roads into rivers. We have all seen the pictures. Most of us experienced Hurricane Sandy, but it still does not compare to what Helene did to the mountains of North Carolina.

Five Little Monkeys is asking the quilting community to please shop the websites of quilt shops that were in the path of Helene. Use the website <u>carolinashophop.com</u> to find a list of the shops she refers to. ALL of these shops are closed indefinitely due to lack of power and water and obliterated roads, but when they are able to get back into their stores, they will ship items. This is their livelihood, so if you shop online, please buy from these shops. They are out helping their community right now, let's try to help them as well, so everyone can get back on their feet again.

Be safe out there and pray for a quick recovery for all affected by Helene.



2024 Raffle Quilt

"Our Hearts Will Go On" by Fabric Addict is the pattern for the 2024 Evening Star Quilters' Raffle Quilt. The quilt is a lovely variation of the Storm at Sea pattern in gray, black, and cranberry red. It measures approximately 90" x 103" and will fit a queen size bed. 5,000 tickets were printed and some have been sold at our previous events, namely Quilts in the Vineyard, the Warren County Fair, and Belvidere Heritage Day. At the September meeting, members were each given 30 tickets to sell and asked to do their best to either sell or purchase the 30 tickets. More tickets are available if you run out! All ticket money and stubs must be turned in to Judy Zeitler by the guild meeting on December 10.

Tickets are \$1 each or six for \$5. Proceeds from the sales are used to benefit future ESQG projects, education, and charities.

Community Service Projects

<u>Blanket-Bags (Judy Zeitler)</u>: The August Tuesday Sew-Day produced 54 blanket bags which added to other bags donated since last December to achieve our donation of 60 blanket-bags to the Children's Home of Easton. Way to go ladies! Please continue to contribute, as we never know how many children will be housed or fostered each Christmas. The bags require 1-1/2 yards of fleece or 3 yards to make two bags. There is no sewing involved - simply cut and tie. Directions are available from Judy Zeitler if you are interested in creating additional bags. The Children's Home of Easton was established in 1885 and continues to provide guidance and support to children in need throughout the Lehigh Valley. The bags are used to gather and present gifts for each child during the holiday season. This is something that will be theirs to keep forever.

<u>Pillowcases (Susan Adler)</u>: Members present at the May Tuesday Sew-Day created 94 pillow cases which were donated to the children's ward at Newton Hospital. Please continue to make pillowcases using novelty prints and child-friendly fabrics. The hospital is very grateful for the contributions!

<u>Chemo Hats & Heart Pillows (Cyndy Ponczek)</u>: Cyndy will lead the Tuesday Sew Day workshop on December 3rd and guide us in making chemo hats and heart pillows. If you wish to make some prior to the workshop, please contact Cyndy Ponczek for patterns and directions.

Love Quilt Project (Lisa Laird): Lisa Laird handed over a dozen Love Quilt tops to the organization in July and received a gracious thank you from Kathy Wesley of the Love Quilt Project group. Kathy was touched by their beauty and combinations of fabrics. Thank you to everyone who participated!

<u>Placemats (Sharon Kubich)</u>: Sharon will be accepting placemat donations between now and Thanksgiving for the Warren County Meals at Home organization {formerly Meals on Wheels). The organization has requested 150 placemats this year. Please consider making dual purpose placemats when creating mats for the holidays. Finished placemats should finish approximately 13" x 18" but can be any size desired.

Rockin' the Round Robin

We had 15 members sign up for this year's Round Robin project, which means a few slight changes to the original plan. There will be three groups of five members each and there will be four borders to your center medallion instead of only three. The final project will be approximately 53" to 54" square.

Participants will receive their group list and instructions at the October meeting. Please attach your group list to the top of your bin. Your center medallion (16-1/2" square unfinished) must be completed by the December meeting.

The exchange schedule has been changed slightly to accommodate the fourth border and will be as follows:

1st exchange - December meeting

2nd exchange - March 2025 meeting

3rd exchange - May meeting

4th exchange - June meeting

5th & final exchange (and big reveal!) - August 2025 meeting.

You may exchange early, but please do not exchange late! Have fun with this project and do your best work! Thank you to Theresa Schoonover for spear-heading this project, and thank you to members who jumped in to participate.

It's a Mystery!



Sharon Kubich will run this year's Mystery Quilt. Sharon handed out fabric requirements at the September meeting. She is encouraging everyone participating to fill in the sample page with your coordinating fabrics. This year's mystery requires six different colors and four fabrics within each color family. Staying organized is key! This is a 12-month mystery project where you will be working on each step at home (or at Tuesday Sew-Day!) until the final step, when the guild will host a workshop so we can assemble our quilt tops and finally reveal the mystery.

There is a \$5 fee to offset printing costs and the luncheon at the assembly workshop next year.

Hospitality Highlights


Susan Adler and Chrissy Hoff have graciously volunteered to run hospitality this year.
