


EVENING STAR QUILTERS GUILD - THE STITCH LINE

The next date will be March 17, when we will be working on pillowcases for the veterans home. As always, Saturday *Stitches in Hope* is available for open sewing or to get help from fellow quilters.

Pet Beds and Supplies

Dixie Sutton presented information on our new charity this year, Father John's Animal House in Lafayette, NJ. Father John's is a non-profit organization that participated in a network of rescue programs that responded to calls of help to save animals in Texas and Florida during the recent hurricanes. They are also partnered with People for Animals to provide low cost medical procedures for animals in our area. Father John's hosts several annual fundraising events, including Tails and Trails at Camp Nejeda, as well as an annual beefsteak dinner, and they provide senior dogs and cats to loving homes in their Still a Best Friend Program.

The three different bed sizes are: 14" x 18"; 18" x 24" and 24" x 36". You can fold the edges and stitch or use binding, your preference.

A list of supplies that can be donated instead of, or in addition to the beds, includes: canned dog and cat foods, non-clumping litter, liquid dish detergent, liquid laundry detergent, bleach, paper towels, tall kitchen garbage bags, Clorox moist wipes (**Not** Lysol), cat toys (**no** feathers), and dog toys (hard rubber chew types). Donated items will be collected by Dixie at the February Guild meeting.



On January 13th, 46 pet beds and blankets for furry friends in need were created at *Stitches in Hope*. Then, ladies attending a quilt retreat at the end of Jan. made 10 more, so as of this printing, a total of 56 pet beds are ready to be donated. If you have any that you've made, please bring to the February 13 Guild meeting.

Sue and her grand-daughters were quite busy. The girls made six pet beds... Sue, not so many... she was a little busy with the girls!




Delightful Demonstrations


Those of you who missed the January meeting missed two wonderful demonstrations prepared by Solvai Sanchez and Pat Howlin. Solvai presented her *Redwork* program, which included some history of the craft and samples of her work. She handed out bits of fabric along with needle and floss so that all of us could try our hand at this technique.

Pat Howlin presented her *Making Felt with Wool* program and encouraged everyone to give it a try. Most of us have already made baby sweaters out of someone's wool sweater, so we get the idea. Pat looks for wools in flea markets and second hand stores and reduces them to usable pieces of felt and incorporates them in her beautiful penny rugs.

Thank you to both ladies for the time and effort put into preparing and demonstrating these unique skills. The program was truly delightful.

A Quilter's Oath


All quilters start out as beginners.
