#### Speaking of History...

On Wednesday, May 16th, Blairstown Historic Preservation Committee held an open house from 3 to 7 pm at the Blairstown Municipal building on Route 94 in Blairstown. Jayne Bodolsky, Dixie Sutton, Rich Danner, and Cindy Smith were on hand to answer any quilt-related questions. Jayne was able to identify the approximate time period of most of the heir-loom quilts the town displayed which seemed to be about the 1880's to 1890's based on the fabrics used. Well-known area names included the Kishpaughs, Labars, and Stoffels. A beautiful grandfather clock was displayed from the Bixler family, known for Bixler Jewelers in Easton, PA. Due to the recent power outages and the weather, attendance was minimal; but the display was worthy of the visit. Well done BHPC! #### Artists Among Us - Part II

Irene lined up another group of artists within our guild for the May meeting. Jayne Bodolsky demonstrated her beautiful works using silk ribbon embroidery techniques, from pillow covers to slippers, table toppers to wall hangings. Glorious colors and beautiful hand-craftsmanship delighted the guild. Jayne passed around several of her pieces as well as a few books on stitches and techniques.

Nancy Geiger, one of our resident painters, displayed her artwork as she traveled through time sketching and painting local sceneries and landscapes. #### Missouri Star Quilt Workshops

During a recent visit to Missouri Star Quilt Co. in Hamilton, MO, Cindy Smith spoke with a few representatives of the company regarding workshop possibilities for our guild. Since the videos are available on YouTube, we are permitted to use those ideas to teach techniques and short cuts to our members provided we do not charge for it. If anyone is interested in "hosting" a Missouri Star workshop during our Stitching in Hope Saturdays this fall, please contact Cindy at your earliest convenience. We will need to coordinate with our charity projects, as well as with each other on which tutorials each host chooses.

Your job as host would be to watch the video of your choice, work up samples, and be comfortable with the method enough to teach it to others. Most of her ideas are a slap to the forehead in the "why didn't I think of that?!" motion. Also, the host will need to provide a list of supplies required for the day and run the workshop. You are teaching a technique, so you are not required to complete a quilt top, but feel free to do so. Jenny offers downloads of her quilt tops, but if you decide to teach her pattern, please have members order it ahead of time.

#### Tin Lizzy for Sale (not the car)

Despite the historical meaning of a Tin Lizzie (the Ford Model T), this quilting machine has been well received among machine quilters for a number of years. Marie Meyer of Forked River, NJ, a friend of Sue DeCamp's, is asking \$3500 for her machine, but is willing to negotiate. The Lizzie has been updated with new sensors for the stitch regulator, ruler base, Falcon wood 12 foot frame with the table for pantographs and shorter poles if you don't want the larger set-up. #### A Ray of Sunshine


