# Stunning Row Quilts Completed

During our June meeting, the balance of the row quilts were displayed across the tables in the back of the room. Beautiful work was done in color, biblical, chicken, beach, and several other themes. Looks like several people in that group enjoyed paper-piecing. Such awesome creations! (See last page of this issue.) #### Speaking of a Challenge... Time to De-Stash!

Solvai Sanchez is spear-heading another UFO challenge for the group this year. In quilting, UFO does not represent Unidentified Flying Objects; it has become the notation commonly referring to Un-Finished Objects. So here is your chance to force yourself to complete one project or one portion of a project each month beginning in October.

Each participating member will give a list of nine (9) objects from his/her studio that he/she wishes to complete during the new guild year. Projects to be considered must have already been started prior to September 2018, and must be listed on the paper given to Solvai at the September meeting. Be sure to keep a copy for yourself, because... Solvai doesn't do this in numerical order... she will choose a number between 1 and 9 each month, and you must complete the project which corresponds to the number she chooses by the following monthly guild meeting. For example, she may select #3 on the list to be completed by October regardless of what project is listed for #1 or #2. If you have a continuing project, please contact Solvai for assistance in how to list the various steps on your project list. Projects may include: add a border to my blue and white quilt, or make the bias binding for the mystery quilt, or make the backing for my Quilt of Valor, or make 9 blocks for my son's wedding quilt, or finish my 2018 row-quilt top! Be specific on your list. Items do not necessarily have to be "finish a quilt." If you have a specific project to finish for Christmas, do NOT include it on your list as projects will be chosen at random.

Now is a good time to de-stash! Some things to keep in mind: know what you have. Is this a project I already despise? Do I love this design? What was I thinking? What is that color anyway? After you have studied your UFO's, choose the nine projects that you really want to finish and put them on your list. If you really aren't feeling any love towards a certain project, put it away for another time, gift it, swap it, or give it away.

This challenge can be as aggressive as you wish based on your lifestyle and time constraints. Each month, beginning with the October meeting, you must bring in the assigned completed project so that Solvai or Rosemarie can mark it off your list. So, join the fun and get things done! #### Victorian Days in Belvidere

Hear Ye! Hear Ye! Belvidere Victorian Days Return! An email was sent out recently regarding Victorian Days being held September 8 - 9, 2018. We continue to seek volunteers to work the weekend on the square in Belvidere. We are located near the corner of Third and Hardwick Streets, Lot #29, on Third Street. Set-up will be from 7 to 8 am on Saturday, and the event will run until 6 pm that day. On Sunday, set-up will be from 9 to 10 am, and the event will run through 5 pm. We will be removing the entire display both evenings prior to departure. Please email, call or text Cindy Smith if you are able to help during the weekend. This is great public visibility and is a wonderful day spent outside. We have a tent and some quilt stands to display the period quilts. If you have a Victorian era quilt, crazy quilt, broderie perse quilt, or whole-cloth quilt you are willing to display, please contact Cindy. The space allowed is 12 feet square; quite different from prior years when we had room to spread out in the middle of the park. Anyone wishing to join us should bring a chair and some handwork to do, if possible. Our raffle quilt will be on display and we will be selling raffle tickets throughout the weekend. Also, all vendors are required to wear period dress, or at the minimum a white blouse and black pants or skirt. Please refer to the email for suggestions. Come join the fun!

#### Quilts of Valor

The quilts of valor quilts are in limbo at the moment. Rich Danner is chairing this project, but has had a rather busy summer. Several members are available now to assist with this project to get it back on track. We are anticipating a Saturday workshop on September 15, if all goes well. More information to follow.

The quilts are slated for completion by November (Veterans' Day). Audrey Planer is accepting names of recipients, so if there is a special veteran in your life to whom you would like to present a quilt, please submit that person's name to Audrey for consideration. Rich anticipates four finished quilts for this November. If we have more than four names submitted, the committee will decide on a fair distribution.

### Warren County Fair

We had a very wet end to the fair again this year which prompted an early closing on Saturday, August 4. Due to heavy rains in the area creating flooding of fair buildings and muddy parking areas, the fair board opted to close this year's fair early. Luckily the quilts were unharmed and removed efficiently by the ladies present on Saturday. Prior to that, Irene and her committee did a wonderful job setting up and running the Folk Arts Barn and Boutique. 23 quilts hung in the show and viewers chose the winners as: First Place - Margaret Grande (ESQG); Second Place- Lorraine Hare (ESQG); and Third Place - Marlene Marlowe (ESQG)! Congratulations to the winners! The boutique gleaned about \$2,100 overall, and we made approximately \$800 in raffle ticket sales. 21 members helped with set-up, take-down, and manning the display and boutique throughout the week. Thank you to everyone who helped and participated in this worthy event. It is a lot of work, but it is one way of getting us out there in the public's eye. People love to visit our displays. We often hear their stories of quilts remembered and those that gave them comfort. Thank you again Irene Compton for chairing the committee this year...and a huge thank you for agreeing to do it again in 2019!
