
Crazy Patch Border Workshop



Paper Piecing With or Without Paper

Unfortunately, our March speaker will be "without"...*The Quilt Block* had to back out of their lecture for the March meeting, but we are looking for someone else to fill in. Sue DeCamp will still hold her workshop for Paper Piecing Without Paper. This is a great project for using up scraps. You will need: 108 - 2" x 5 1/2" rectangles of dark fabrics and 108 - 2" x 5 1/2" rectangles of light to medium fabrics. Avoid neutrals in both groups and put all your dark rectangles in a bag marked *Dark Fabric* and all your light rectangles in a bag marked *Light Fabric*. You will also need 24" of both a light neutral and a dark neutral for your background fabrics. Further cutting directions can be picked up at the February meeting. In addition to regular sewing supplies, please bring a 6" x 12" ruler, highlighter, 1/4" ruler (optional), and a glue stick. There is no charge for this workshop. It will be held **Saturday, March 16**th, at St. John's Methodist Church in Hope, NJ from **9 am to 3 pm**. Please see Irene Compton to sign up!


Get well wishes go out to Jayne Bodolsky following her surgery last month. Hopefully she's already up and around again!
