Mystery Quilt Workshop

The date for this year's mystery quilt workshop is Saturday February 8, 2020. Marlene Marlowe and Leana McCutcheon are already handing out fabric requirements. The fee is \$20 per person and includes the workshop, instructions, and lunch. Sign up with Marlene at any meeting prior to the February date. This year's mystery is the Bedford Mystery #4 and is 48" square without borders. The pattern promises to be a great scrap buster!

Laura Lyman to Speak on Orphan Blocks

Our speaker for the November meeting will be Laura Lyman. Laura comes to us from Pocono Lake, PA and is wellknown for her scrap quilts. Laura is new to the stage, but is well-versed in the art of quilting and will show us how to use orphan blocks in quilts and other projects. Please plan to attend our November meeting! The Saturday following the meeting (November 16), Cindy Smith will lead a workshop using your own orphan blocks, so start gathering those little guys together. You will be surprised at how many you find in your sewing room!

Ugly Fabric Challenge

The guild will be hosting an Ugly Fabric Challenge this year beginning in November. All you need to participate is one yard of an ugly fabric from your stash. Paper bags will be available at the October meeting. Place your yardage in the paper bag and bring it to the November meeting. We will hold an exchange so you do not receive your own fabric. The fabric you win in November must be used in a quilt (minimum size 36" square) or a handbag/tote and must be completed by the June meeting. The fabric must be an integral part of your quilt/tote and be recognizable in the finished project. Keep a 5" square of the ugly fabric to display with your finished project in June. Are you up for the challenge? Please join the fun in November!

Red and White Quilt Block

Sharon Rehrig will coordinate a red and white quilt block-of-the-month for the month of February this year. If you would like to participate, please sign up by the November meeting. The fee is \$5, but will be refunded when you return your block. The guild will supply the fabric kits at the December meeting for all who signed up. Return your completed block by February and receive your \$5 refund, and a chance to win all of the blocks or enough to make a quilt, depending on how many blocks are returned! Our Promise to Family Promise

Please continue to make and bring in items for the tricky tray tables at our biennial quilt show! Family Promise is counting on us to help our local families get back on their feet. All items must be handmade. Items may include: table runners, placemats, microwave bowls, pot holders, lap quilts, crib quilts, wine bags, totes, etc. Items brought in early can be given to Bonnie Eamigh or Margaret Grande. The guild will match donated funds made through the tricky tray up to \$500.

Marble Maze Quilts

One of our charity projects this year will be creating marble maze quilts. These quilts are approximately 8" x 10", made of minky fabric or soft polar fleece, and include a flat marble. Similar to the fidget quilts, an autistic child or alzheimer's patient can fiddle with the quilt to keep their minds active. Judy Zeitler will be hosting the workshop in January to complete these quilts and find homes for these little guys. Please plan to attend on January 18 in Hope, NJ!

Harvest of Quilts October 19 & 20, 2019

It's Show Time! It's here folks! Our biennial quilt show is upon us once again. Quilts are ready to go, flowers are ordered, frames are organized, food is getting prepared. Be ready! It's going to be another beautiful show! If you have not already signed up to work, please do so at the October meeting! Two hour shifts at any spot: sell raffle tickets, wear white gloves, serve food in the café - no job is difficult and all are necessary to keep the show running. Friday afternoon is the all-hands-on-deck scenario from 3:30 pm to about 8:30 pm. It takes time to set up the show, but once it's up, it is glorious! If you have items we can use for displays (antique ironing boards, dolls, cribs, pumpkins, quilt hoops, whatever, please bring it Friday night. These little things make our show even more enjoyable for the public. The only thing more comforting than a beautiful quilt is the memory you bring front and center from items in the displays. Remember also to bring your 7/16" deep socket rachet and hand tools, work gloves for handling the frames, and of course your quilts! Husbands, sons, daughters, friends...the more hands we have the less time it takes to get this together. Leo Club members will be on hand to help lift the frames and run the quilts. There is something to be done by everyone who attends regardless of your abilities.

Baked Goods for the Show: Everyone is encouraged to bring baked goods to the show either on Friday night or Saturday morning. You do not have to separate them, but if you can bring them in disposable containers, that alleviates the possible loss of lids etc. If you do use a container, mark EVERYTHING, the lid, the plate, the container, etc. Things get washed and separated during the day, so please keep that in mind when packaging up your baked goods. Cakes are welcome and do not need to be cut ahead of time. PLEASE DO NOT USE NUTS! Belvidere is a nut free zone, so do not bake anything with nuts.

Magazine and Book Sale: Please bring all magazines and books to Solvai Sanchez preferably before the weekend, but certainly no later than Friday night. Sort magazines by title and date in order to help with the organization. The magazine sale will be in the cafeteria this year.

Road Signs: Please plan to sign up and take a couple of show signs to place in your neighborhood. If you place these signs, be sure to collect them after the show closes on Sunday, October 20th. We have had problems in the past with road crews and other people taking down our signs. We do recycle them with each show, so be sure to grab them after the show and return them to Irene or Audrey. They are stored in Audrey's barn.

BBO Chefs: Irene will hand out meat for the BBQ at the October meeting. Ladies who signed up to make the BBQ, be sure to bring a small cooler to the meeting.

Tricky Tray Items: Please bring your handmade items for the Tricky Tray to the October meeting. If you have been unable to make something yet, let Bonnie know at the meeting so she has enough containers for the show. Items can be aprons, placemats, microwave bowls, wall-hangings, crib quilts, lap quilts, table-runners, whatever you can create. Proceeds will go to Family Promise of Warren County and will be matched up to \$500 by our guild after the show.

Registered Quilts: Those of you who registered quilts for the show, be sure to bring your quilts in a pillowcase on Friday night to set up. Your quilt and pillowcase should be marked with your name and address or phone number (write it on muslin and baste it to your quilt and pillowcase). Postcards will be handed out at the October meeting

Quilt Show Signs to be Returned

Letters have been ordered to update the signs with dates and times, for the upcoming Quilt Show and we need to know how many we have available to display prior to the show. PLEASE return any signs you may have!
