Orphan Blocks with Laura Lyman

Our **November** guest speaker will be Laura Lyman of Pocono Lake, PA. Laura will present a trunk show and lecture to show us how we can use those leftover blocks from previous projects or Block-of-the-Month items. We all have them... blocks that just did not suit the quilt, that leftover block that just did not fit, or an abandoned project just too difficult to complete. Gather your blocks and see what you can do! Laura will offer several ways to use those abandoned blocks and create useful and beautiful items. The following **Saturday**, **November 16th**, Cindy Smith will lead the Stitches in Hope workshop so that members can give their orphan blocks a forever home.

Ugly Fabric Challenge

Last year we finished our UFO's, this year we may be creating one! Do you have a fabric in your stash that you bought and now wonder why? This year's challenge is the Ugly Fabric Challenge and the rules are simple. Dig into your stash. Find one yard of cotton fabric that you just cannot stand anymore and will never use. Put that fabric in a small paper bag so no one can see it and bring it to the November meeting. In November, you will receive someone else's ugly fabric and put your mind to work on how to use it. The finished product is due at the June,2020 meeting and can be a pillow, a purse or tote, or a small quilt. Save a 5 inch square of that hideous thing so that we can see what you had to deal with. Be sure there is a recognizable amount of that "thing" in your quilt or finished product. It will be fun to see how creative we can be!

Red and White Exchange Block

Sharon Rehrig will coordinate a red and white block of the month for the February meeting. The guild will be purchasing the fabrics, two reds and one white, for a simple star block using half-square triangles. If you are interested in participating, there is a \$5 fee which is refundable when you return your block. Sign-up is mandatory by the November meeting. The fabric and directions will be handed out at the December meeting. Blocks are due at the February meeting. A drawing will be held in February for the winner of the blocks. Multiple winners are possible depending on the number of blocks submitted. These blocks will make a beautiful red and white quilt!

Raffle Tickets

The 2019 Raffle quilt tickets will be handed out at the November meeting. Tickets were sold at the Warren County Fair, and will be sold at Victorian Days in September and at our Harvest of Quilts quilt show in October. Following the quilt show, Lelane Hoose will bundle and distribute any leftover tickets to guild members. Please make every effort to sell your set of tickets. If you are unable to sell them, please consider purchasing your bundle (and use the names of deserving friends and relations!) or contact Lelane so she can transfer your tickets to another member. The raffle tickets help to fund our guild by paying for guest speakers, workshops, and charity project supplies. All tickets must be sold by the December meeting. The drawing for the winning ticket is held Tuesday, December 10th at 8 pm during our holiday meeting.

Victorian Days are here again as Belvidere Heritage celebrates it's 31st year of this famous festival in Belvidere, NJ. The festivities begin Friday, September 6th with a Cotillion at the Red Frame Mill, then follows with two days in Garret Wall Park at the center of Belvidere. Saturday will begin at 9:30 am and run through 6 pm, and Sunday from 11:30 am until **4 pm**. This event is held rain or shine, so let's all pray for some beautiful sunshine!

Our area is along Third Street and will display our 2019 Raffle Quilt, as well as quilts made during the Victorian Era and reproductions of those quilts. Due to the nature of our display, it will be set up and taken down each day to ensure the safety of our quilts. Displays are needed for the quilt show. Please bring items for displays such as antique ironing boards, quilt racks, small trunks, old-fashioned dolls, etc., to enhance our display area. This is one area people really comment on that was unique with our show and often imitated. Please be sure to mark all of your items so that they can be returned to you at the end of the show.

Tricky Tray items are needed for our fundraiser to support Family Promise of Warren County this year. Items can include placemats, microwave bowls, small quilts, wall hangings, wine bags, purses, anything your little heart desires! If you have any questions, please contact Bonnie Eamigh.

Baked goods are needed for the cafe the weekend of the show. All members are asked to bring their baked goods in disposable containers so that lids and things do not go missing. You do not need to pre-cut cakes, the cafe personnel will divide the desserts accordingly. Please **DO NOT USE NUTS**. Belvidere High School is nut-free due to excessive allergies of students attending the school. If you have any questions, please contact Irene Compton.
